

	<p>Challenge a sibling or grown-up to a 1-minute challenge! Use a stopwatch (a grown-up might have one on their phone), sand timer or clock to time 1 minute. See how many jumps, stretches, star jumps, hops or other actions each person can do before the time runs out. Who can do the most?</p> 	<p>Find a simple jigsaw puzzle to do. Use a clock or timer to see how long it takes you to complete the puzzle. Then, break the puzzle up and try again. Can you complete the puzzle more quickly on the second try?</p> 	<p>Day and Night Sorting What do you do in the daytime? What do you do at night time? You could draw pictures for each activity or take photographs to stick on.</p>  <p><i>Differentiating Between Day and Night</i></p>	 <p>Make your own clock using a paper plate or by cutting a circle out of cardboard. Use a real clock to help you to write the numbers correctly and make your own clock hands. For an extra challenge, you could practise moving the hands to tell different times.</p>	<p>Play 'What's the time, Mr Wolf?' with your family? You could use your clock from yesterday.</p> <p>What's the Time Mr Wolf?</p> 

<p>Topic</p>	<p>Penguins live near the South Pole. The little boy needs to do some research to find out where it is.</p> <p>Do you know where it is? Look on the globe or an atlas or on the internet. Is it near or far away from where you live?</p> <p>How do you think you could travel there?</p> <p>What clothes would we need to wear if we visited the South Pole?</p> 	<p>Ice Investigators!</p> <p>Put some ice cubes into a tray. Encourage children to explore what happens as the ice melts.</p> <p>What could make the ice melt faster?</p>  <p>You could add some toy polar animals to extend the play.</p>	<p>Can you make a boat for one of your toys? Make sure it is big enough for them to fit in. You could use a box and decorate it. You can choose how big or small it is. To make your penguin you could use cardboard, paint, playdough, collage materials etc.</p>   	<p>Scissor Skills!</p> <p>The South Pole is cold and snowy. Provide some circles of white paper and encourage the children to fold and cut pieces out to create paper snowflakes.</p>
