
Personal, Social, Health Education (PSHE)

Collective Worship

In Collective Worship this week we thought about how we all need friends, including the qualities that make a good friend and how we show these. This fitted perfectly with the theme of 'One Kind Word' which we have also been exploring as part of our anti-bullying week work. We thought about how it feels to be left out, why people leave others out and why people choose not to help if they see someone who is left out.

We used the story in 1 Samuel 19 to think about how Saul treated David. One of the things that happened to David was that King Saul tried to isolate him and leave him out because he knew that God had chosen David as the next king. Saul became jealous and attacked David in different ways – he even tried to kill David. David escaped and found people who supported him and helped him to become the king as God intended.

We understand that leaving other people out in ways that mean that they have no-one to be riend or support them can be a form of bullying and we are going to continue to work hard to make sure that this does not happen in our school.

Rapid Coronavirus (COVID-19) testing

Household members of primary age children are eligible to access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. Tests are fast, easy and free. You can order home test kits online. Order rapid lateral flow home test kits or you can collect from a home test kit collection point. Find your nearest

home test kit collection point. Please note that these tests are for adults within the family, not the children.

Coronavirus Symptoms

Children or staff with any of the three symptoms of Covid:

- · a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss or change to your sense of taste or smell

are to stay at home and isolate. They should get a Covid test.

The rest of the household do not need to isolate **IF** they are under the age of 18 years 6 months or have been double vaccinated — please note this important change. It is recommended that contacts of a confirmed case do undertake a PCR test.

If your child tests positive for Covid you must immediately inform the school – by telephone on 01304 206887 during the school day. If you get a positive result at the weekend, during the evening or in a school holiday please email office@stmarysprimary.net
