## Parent Governor Vacancies

Do you have some time to give to the school in a voluntary capacity? Would you be interested in joining our governing body? If so look out for a letter coming out next week seeking nominations for two new parent governors for St Mary's.

The Governors meet once a term – on a Wednesday at 4.30pm and meetings last for about an hour and a half to two hours. In usual times these meetings are held at the school, for the last couple of years they have been via video link. There are papers to read before the meeting in preparation for the conversations to be had. In addition to a meeting once a term, governors need to be able to give time to coming into school between meetings to meet with senior leaders or subject leaders and to visit the classes. There is also a requirement to attend training – courses are put on by the education department in Kent and, at the moment, are all held via video link. The courses are very accessible, are aimed at governors - most of whom are not educational professionals - and help governors to understand their role and responsibilities.

Governors work as a team – no-one is expected to know everything and the contributions of all governors, including parent governors, helps the governing body to support the school to be the best it can be.

When the letter comes out which seeks nominations do please give this some thought. If you would like any further information you are welcome to speak to me or Mr Lamprell or Liz Fisher our Chair of Governors, Trish Simmons and Joe Yarrow our Vice-Chairs.

# **Coronavirus Symptoms**

### Updated Guidance

From 11 January in England, people <u>without</u> symptoms who receive positive lateral flow device (LFD) test results for coronavirus (COVID-19) will be required to self-isolate immediately and won't be required to take a confirmatory PCR test.

Anyone who develops 1 of the 3 main COVID-19 symptoms should stay at home and self-isolate and get a PCR test (see below). They must self-isolate if they get a positive test result, even if they have had a recent negative lateral flow test – these rules have not changed.

Children or staff with any of the three symptoms of Covid:

- a new continuous cough;
- a fever;
- a change in taste or smell

are to stay at home and isolate. They should get a PCR Covid test.

#### Changes to the self-isolation period for individuals who test positive for COVID-19

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be <u>reported to NHS Test and Trace</u>.

If the result of either of the tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is the earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.

## Daily testing for close contacts of COVID-19

People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, <u>should take an LFD test every day for seven days</u> and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

## Keeping School Informed

If your child tests positive for Covid you must inform the school – by telephone on 01304 206887 during the school day. If your child tests positive 'out of hours' we do not need to know until the morning of the first day of absence – as with all sickness absence.
