### Collective Worship at St Mary's CEP

The people of faith and the people that made a difference that we have looked at so far this term in our Collective Worship have been people who have had to be prepared to stand up for what they believe. This week we thought about how that is not too difficult if people stand with you and beside you but is not so easy when you find yourself standing alone and speaking alone.

Christians believe that the prophets in the Old Testament were the people whom God sent to give his message. Very often they found that people did not want to listen or laughed at them or even attacked them.

We explored the Bible story about the prophet Jonah. Jonah knew that the message God wanted him to give the people would be unpopular so he ran away and hid before eventually doing as he had been asked.

You could talk to your child about how to speak up if they see anything that they know is wrong. In our Collective Worship we wondered about whether it is sometimes easier to pretend you did not see the wrong thing and go the other way as Jonah did.

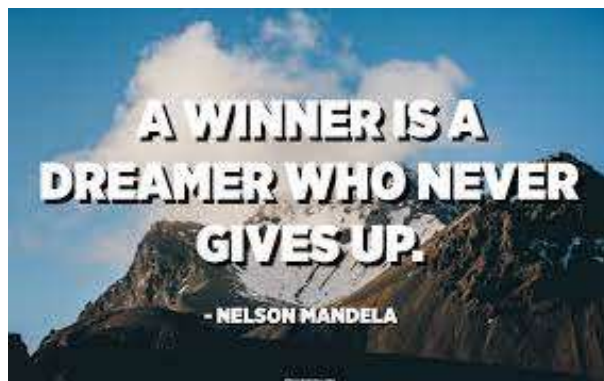

## Coronavirus Symptoms

On Tuesday 29 March, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, set out the next steps for living with COVID-19 in England from Friday, 1 April.

### Updated guidance

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. Children and young people with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days, which is when they are most infectious.

Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature. Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious.
