## Term 4 - 2023

The Turtles have had a super term and the children have enjoyed learning lots of new skills! They can now use their phonic knowledge to read and write simple sentences. In Maths, we have been exploring numbers 9 & 10 and have used a variety of manipulatives to explore the composition of each number. We have also learnt the names of different 3D shapes and enjoyed making our own 3D models.

In our Topic work, we have loved learning about Spring weather, what plants need to grow, different minibeasts and the names of different fruits and vegetables.

Mrs Tomkinson, Mrs Cassingena and Miss Haves are so proud of the progress the children have made this term. They always try their best and have produced some FANTASTIC work.

<u>P.E.</u>

In PE this term, the children in Class R our focus has been multi skills. They have taken part in different challenges including various running/obstacle games and working together to improve team performance.

Next term, the children will begin practising activities for Sports Day.

Children are expected to wear their PE kit into school on a Thursday. PE kit must consist of a white or house coloured t-shirt, black or blue leggings/tracksuit bottoms/shorts and trainers or plimsols.

It is important that the children have the correct PE kit so they are able to take part in PE lessons safely and effectively. Earrings must be removed before school on PE days.



<u>Reading</u>

Classes R, 1 and 2



The children bring home two books each week, to read at home.

- A Success for All Phonics reading scheme book
  - A 'reading for pleasure' book

Books will go home every Friday and need to be returned with the purple reading record every Wednesday.

The children work hard in their phonics reading sessions using their reading scheme book each week. Please read for 5-10 minutes daily to help your child practise their reading skills. Please record this in the purple book every time you read at home.

The children should be reading for 5 – 10 minutes every day to ensure they are getting the practice they need to develop their reading skills further.
