### What to do

#### Choose a school

It's important to find out more about the schools you are interested in before you decide to name them on the application form.\*

You can name up to three schools. These can be anywhere in England.

#### Apply

A simple, fast, convenient process which opens **Friday 3 November 2023** and closes at midnight on **Monday 15 January 2024**.

You can apply at any time of the day. You will receive an email confirmation that your application has been submitted correctly and that the LA has received it.\*\*

You can log back in at any time to view that information entered is correct.

#### Accept or decline

On offer day (**Tuesday 16 April 2024**) an email will be sent after 4pm informing you of your offer.\*\*\*

You must accept or decline the school place you have been offered by **Tuesday 30 April 2024**.

If it has not been possible to offer your child a place in your preferred school, you have the right to add their name to the waiting list and lodge an appeal.

## Is your child starting Year 7 in September 2024?

A reminder to our Class 6 parents/carers that the application to apply for your child's secondary school place **closes at midnight on Tuesday 31st October 2023**.

### What to do

#### Choose a school

It's important to find out more about the schools you are interested in before you decide to name them on the application form.

Read the Guide to Secondary admissions at [www.kent.gov.uk/secondaryadmissions](http://www.kent.gov.uk/secondaryadmissions).

You can name up to four Secondary schools, inside or outside of Kent, but you must name them all on the same application.

#### Apply for a school place

A simple, fast, convenient process which opens **Friday 1 September 2023** and closes at midnight on **Tuesday 31 October 2023**.

If you already have an account set up from the Kent Test process, please use these login details.

You will receive an email confirmation that your application has been submitted correctly and that the LA has received it.

You can log back in at any time to view the information submitted.

#### Receiving your offer

On offer day (**Friday 1 March 2024**) an email will be sent after 4pm informing you of your offer.

You must accept or decline the school place you have been offered by **Friday 15 March 2024**.

If we have not offered your child a place in your preferred school, you have the right to appeal. You can also add their name to the school's waiting list if your child is eligible for admission.

I wish you all a good half term break. Remember that Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October is a staff training day and children do not attend school. We look forward to seeing everyone back on Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> October.
