## A Message from Ms Comfort

Welcome to Term 2 which has certainly started with a bang! As I write this on Friday morning the sun is shining and the air is still – a very sharp contrast to this time yesterday. I thank David Trelfer, our Site Manager, for his efforts in assessing the site today and clearing up the debris.

### Staff Training

Staff training on Monday was about ways in which we can continue to support all of our children with their behavioural needs, including those who, for whatever reason, find aspects of life – including school - more challenging.

Some really important messages for us all to think about:

1. All behaviour is a form of communication and is often an attempt to control the environment in which we find ourselves.
2. No child comes to school with the sole aim to deliberately disrupt.
3. Children that need the most love often ask for it in the most unlovable of ways – we all need to be their hope, to be their change and to be there for them.

As a staff team we work tirelessly to meet the needs of *all* member of our school community. We recognise that when a child presents with challenging behaviour at school this will have an effect on other members of the school community. We therefore work to keep everyone safe, to minimise the impact of behaviour, to avoid crisis, to help the child to return to a calm state and to learn to self-regulate their behaviour where they can.

We work with the whole class to help children who do not struggle with managing their own behaviour to understand that we are all different. Each of us has a variety of needs and therefore things need to be done differently for some people – and that is ok.

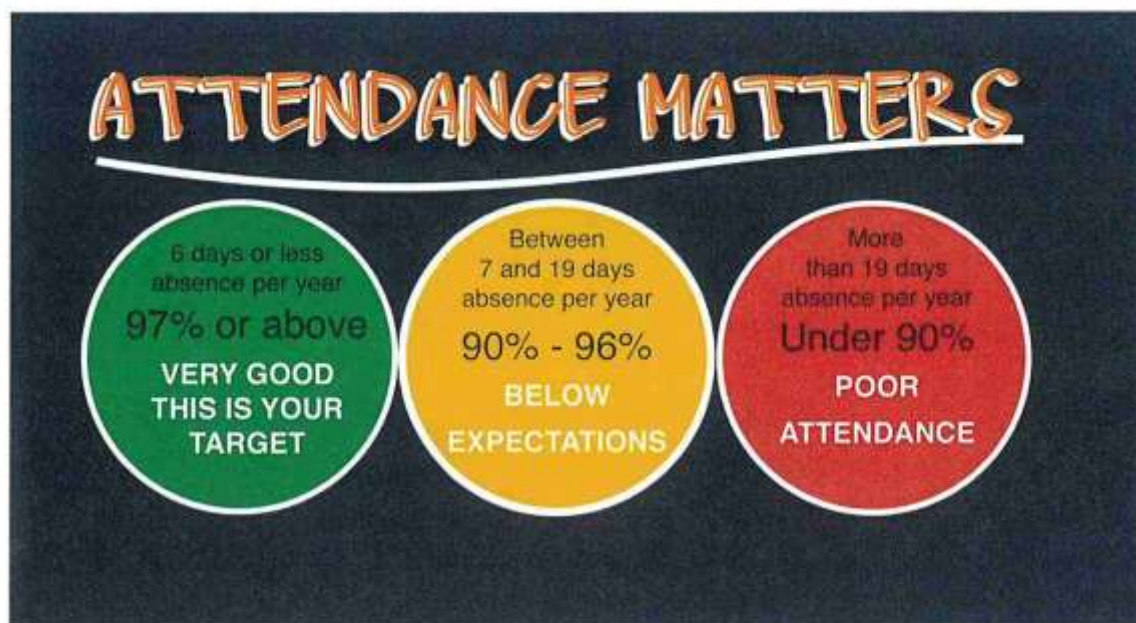

## E-scooters – are you breaking the law?



Can I ride my e-scooter to school or work?

No, it's Illegal...

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles and are required to be taxed and insured. It's not possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters, which means it's illegal to use them.

Can I ride my e-scooter on the pavement?

No, it's Illegal...

You cannot use e-scooters on public footpaths, cycle lanes or roads.

What happens if I'm caught using my e-scooter in public spaces?

The scooter may be seized and as a result, destroyed.

If stopped by an officer, you may be asked to complete a breath and drugs test. You also risk a £300 fine and six penalty points on your licence for no insurance.



### Think before you buy:
