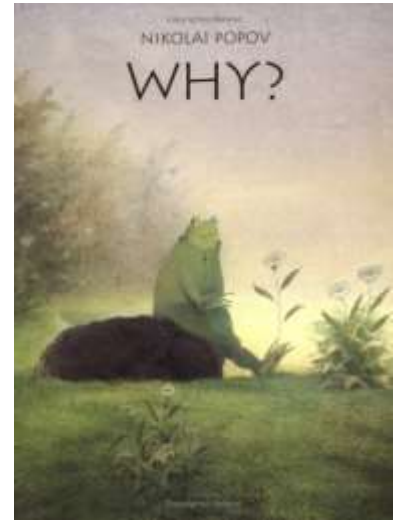

What should I do if my child is absent?

Our school attendance policy clearly asks a parent to call the school to report their child's absence before 9am on the day of the absence (and each subsequent day of absence), and to advise when you expect your child to return to school.

If we do not hear from you, we will:

1. Make a phone call to the main contact number.
2. If there is no response, we will call all emergency contacts to ascertain a reason.
3. If there is still no response or nobody knows why your child is absent, you may receive a home visit from a member of staff.

We may also seek advice from Children's Social Care or the police as your child will then be classed as 'a missing child'. The police may carry out a welfare check.

These procedures are to ensure that we know where your child is and that you are all safe.
