The event was rounded off by the children singing Twinkle, Twinkle Christmas Lights and Father Christmas in his Sleigh.

Christingle Service

Earlier this week the children all made Christingles at school in preparation for our Christingle Service which was held today at school. Each element of a Christingle has a special meaning. The orange represents the world, the red tape represents the love and blood of Christ, the dried fruit represent all of God's creations and the lit candle represents Jesus's light in the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness.

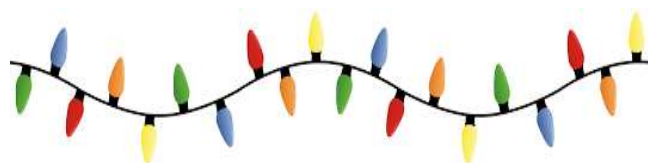
