<u>Reading</u>

Reading continues to be a high priority in Upper Key Stage 2. The ability to read fluently and with sound undertanding will give your child the best chance of achieving well when they move onto the secondary phase of their education. We ask children to continue to read regularly at home and reward them for doing so with raffle tickets for the end of term prize. In Class 5, pupils also have the opportunity to win 'spots for their fish' by completing and passing Accelerated Reading quizzes on the books they have tackled. When the children have gathered 6 'spots' they are given a book prize.
