P.E.

Please ensure you bring in your PE kits in a drawstring bag on these days, remove jewellery and tie long hair back. Remember to bring in jogging bottoms and jumpers in the colder and rainy days!



Reading

The children in Key Stage 2 are all given a reading book that is matched to their Accelerated Reader level. We assess this termly and adjust the choice of books accordingly. As the books are different lengths the children can return them when they are finished and select a new book to take home. Alongside their reading book they have a purple reading record that is for you to record everytime your child reads at home. Everytime they bring their reading record back to school signed by an adult, the children receive a raffle ticket for a chance of winning the termly book prize!

The children should be reading for 5 - 10 minutes every day to ensure they are getting the practice they need to develop their reading skills further.
