There has certainly been a drop in the temperature this week and the children had a great time playing in the very brief snow flurry which we had on Monday. Gloves, hats and scarves certainly help to keep the children warm at this time of year.

School Census Day – Thursday, 18th January 2024

As you may know, school meals for children in Classes R, 1 and 2 are centrally funded by the government. All maintained schools have a census taken in October, January and May. On these days information is collated which leads directly to how much funding the school receives, which includes money to fund your child's free meals.

The second census of the academic year will take place on Thursday, 18th January.

The school is required to record the uptake of the Universal Infant Free School Meals on the day, and I am asking that <u>all</u> children in Classes R, 1 and 2 register to have a hot school meal on Thursday, 18th January. By eating on the census day, you secure funding for your child for the year, and then you are flexible to choose when/if they eat hot school lunches. The menu on Thursday, 18th January will be **beef burger in a bun or veggie pasta bake, potato salad, fruit crumble & custard.**

SEND Spotlight

SEND Coffee Morning – Thursday, 18th January



Our Special Educational Needs & Disabilities Coffee Morning is being held on **Thursday**, **18**th **January** between 9:00am and 10:00am in the school hall.

SEND stands for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities and can cover a wide range of challenges, including learning difficulties, physical disabilities, sensory impairments, communication difficulties, and more. It's a term used in education to refer to children who benefit from additional support or resources. This support is aimed at helping them reach their full potential and participate in school life as fully as possible.

Your child may already be on our SEND register, or you may be at the early stages of identifying your child's needs or have questions about some of their behaviour. You may be unsure about how to support your child at home. We will endeavour to answer some of your questions or provide signposting at this event.

This coffee morning aims to create a supportive and welcoming environment for parents, caregivers, and anyone involved with children who have special educational needs or disabilities. It's an opportunity for us to come together, share experiences, and foster a sense of community.

What to do

Choose a school

It's important to find out more about the schools you are interested in before you decide to name them on the application form.

Read the guide to Primary admissions at <u>www.kent.gov.uk/</u> primaryadmissions.

You can name up to three Primary schools, inside or outside of Kent, but you must name them all on the same application.

Apply for a school place

A simple, fast, convenient process which opens Friday 3 November 2023 and closes at midnight on Monday 15 January 2024.

You will first need to set up an online account. The applicant is you, the parent/carer; you will then need to add your child's details before starting an application. You will receive a confirmation email that your application has been correctly submitted.

You can log back in at any time to view the information submitted.

Receiving your offer

On offer day (Tuesday 16 April 2024) an email will be sent after 4pm informing you of your offer.

You must accept or decline the school place you have been offered by **Tuesday 30 April 2024**. A link to a guide with information you will need to provide the school with will be in your offer email.

If it has not been possible to offer your child a place in your preferred school, you have the right to appeal. You can also add their name to the school's waiting list.

Moving house during the application window will likely complicate your application and we therefore advise you to pay special attention to key dates in the admissions process. KCC has no discretionary authority to vary the process for parents who cannot complete address moves in time to make use of them for admissions purposes. If you have queries relating to this, please email the team on one of the email addresses below.

Friday 3 November 2023	Online application process opens. Go to www.kent.gov.uk/primaryadmissions to register and apply.
Monday 15 January 2024	Online application process closes for the main round. Any amendments after this date must be emailed to kentonlineadmissions@kent.gov.uk
Tuesday 16 April 2024	Offers of school places sent to parents via email after 4pm.
Tuesday 30 April 2024	Parents should contact the school to accept/refuse the place that has been offered and can use the link in the offer email to ask for their child to be added to the waiting list of schools named on the original application.
Tuesday 14 May 2024	Appeals need to be lodged by this date to be heard before September – appeals information can be found at <u>www.kent.gov.uk/schoolappeals</u> . You can only appeal for schools that were named on the application form.
