Through exploring the story of the woman at the well in John 4:1-26 we thought about how her 'glass' was filled. We looked at the idea that every bit of love we receive in a day fills our glass a bit more. Every bit of love we give fills the glass of someone else a bit more.

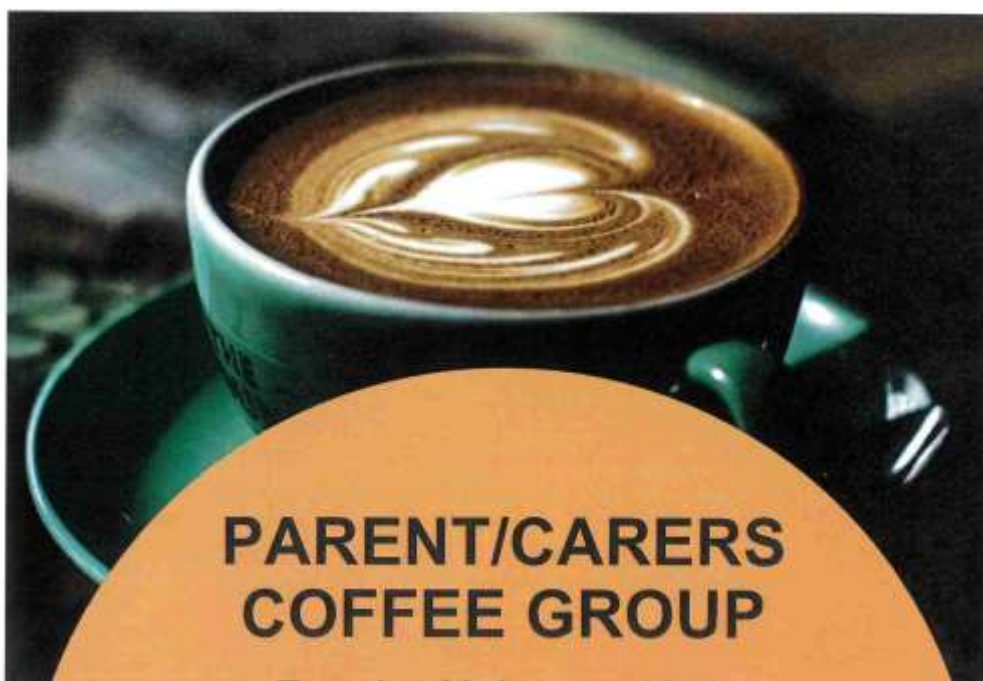
