

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF MY CHILD IS
GOING TO BE LATE OR ABSENT?

- If your child is going to be late or absent, please call the school office on 01304 206887 or a leave a message or send an email by 9:00am to explain the reason for the absence.
- If we do not hear from you and are unable to contact you then the session/sessions will be marked as unauthorised.
- We care about the welfare of our pupils, so please call us **EACH DAY** of your child's absence so we are kept updated.
- Because we have a duty of care for safeguarding our pupils, if we do not know why your child is absent, we will try and call you and any other contacts we have for your child. If we are unable to establish why your child is off school we may need to conduct a home visit to ensure you and your child are safe.
- If you are struggling to get your child to school please contact the school office and they will be able to arrange a meeting with Mrs D Morris, the School's Flo so that support can be offered.
- If your child's absence is of concern, you will receive a letter informing you of your child's attendance rate and offering support.
- If your child's attendance does not significantly improve you will be invited to a meeting with Mrs D Morris and/or Mr Lamprell the Head of School, to ascertain the support needed to improve your child's attendance. Further monitoring will continue.
- If after a meeting in school your child's attendance continues to cause concern the Local Authority may issue a Penalty Notice fine or instigate legal proceedings.
