All staff were busy on Monday as they received their statutory safeguarding update training. We were delighted to welcome all children back to school on Tuesday – thank you to you all for your efforts with school uniform and in getting your children to school on time.

Our new Reception Class children have been superstars, happily coming into school and playing so well together during the day. There is a lot for them to get used to and they have all taken it in their stride.

Class 6

The children in Class 6 have risen very well to the status of being 'top of the school' this week. Some of them will sit the Kent Test next Thursday. This is the test (sometimes referred to as the 11+) which children take right at the very start of Year 6 if their families wish them to, if they pass they are able to be considered for a place at one of the grammar schools. We talk parent/carers through this process in the summer of Year 5.

We are looking forward to families of children in Classes 1-6 coming into school at pick-up time for our first open afternoon of the year. The families in Reception Class visited and received information last term.

Please collect your child(ren) as usual at home time and then if your child is in Class 1 or 2 come back into school via the main entrance at Laureston Place. Those of you who collect children from the bottom playground can come up the steps to the lower door on the Key Stage 2 corridor and will be let in there.

Staff will be in their classrooms, there will be a PowerPoint with information for the year ahead on the board as well as a copy for you to pick up.

It was lovely to welcome the children back this week and to welcome our new Year R children. As we start a new academic year I just wanted to remind you that we at St Mary's CEP expect every child to attend school 100% of the time.

Research has shown that children with low attendance do not progress and achieve as well as those with 96% and above attendance. It is, therefore, really important for your child to be in school every day. However, if your child isn't able to attend school, please do contact the school office before 9:00am. If you do not contact the school when you child is absent this becomes a safeguarding concern which could result in the school making a home visit to check that you and your child are safe.

And finally, it is also really important that your child arrives at school on time. Children who arrive late are automatically at a disadvantage to their classmates as they may have missed teacher input about the days learning. Also, some children find it really difficult to enter a classroom or Collective Worship when everyone else is settled. So please ensure that your child arrives in school at 8.40 every day.


