We are excited to share the wonderful learning adventures your children have been experiencing this term!

Here is an overview of what Term 4 had in store for our curious minds:

We explored important mathematical concepts through fun activities and practical examples. The children developed their understanding of multiplication and division, as well as measuring length and height using different units. In our Science lessons, we learned about the stages of growing up and the importance of exercise to keep our bodies healthy. In History, we explored the fascinating history of how humans learned to fly, focusing on inspiring figures like Bessie Coleman and the incredible achievement of the moon landing. In DT, we created our very own fairground wheel. This was a fantastic opportunity to use creativity and engineering skills. In English, we explored fascinating texts and different genres that sparked imagination and inspired us in our writing.

Homework

Homework is given on a Friday and children are expected to return their completed tasks to school on Wednesday the following week.

Homework consists of a times table, weekly spellings, grammar, reading and handwriting tasks. For every task completed, 2 house points will be awarded! Children who regularly complete the homework tasks will receive a special certificate to celebrate their hard work and perseverance.



P.E.

Our PE days are Thursdays and Fridays.



Please ensure that your child has the following items for PE lessons:

- A drawstring containing a PE kit.
- PE kit consists of a pair of trainers or plimsolls.
- A white t-shirt or t-shirt matching your child's house colour.
- A pair of black or blue PE shorts.



You may also wish to provide your child with a jumper and tracksuit bottoms for colder weather.

This term children have enjoyed exploring and perfecting their ball and target skills:

Children developed their ball control, passing and dribbling skills. They also worked on ball rolling, overarm and underarm throwing, striking and dodging.

In Term 5, we will explore and work on the skills in Striking and Fielding as well as Net and Wall Games.



Reading



The children in Class 2 are all given a reading book that is matched to their Accelerated Reader level. We assess this termly and adjust the choice of books accordingly. As the books are different lengths the children can return them when they are finished and select a new book to take home. Alongside their reading book they have a purple reading record that is for you to record everytime your child reads at home.

Books will continue to go home every Friday and need to be returned with the purple reading record every **Wednesday.**

Children will also be bringing a book home to enjoy and read for pleasure. We encourage you to spend some time with your child, reading together and discussing the stories, characters, and pictures.

The children should be reading for 5 – 10 minutes every day to ensure they are getting the practice they need to develop their reading skills further.

We recently made another visit to the newly refurbished library, and it was wonderful to explore the amazing range of free books available.

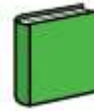
