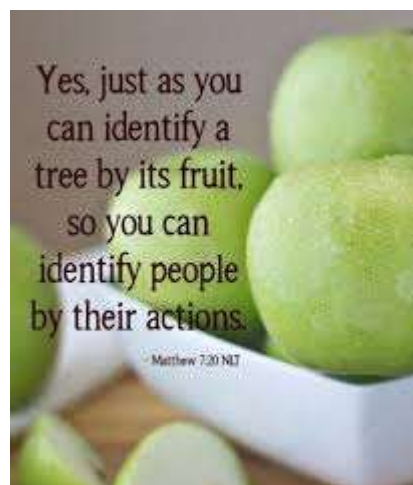


Collective Worship at St Mary's

Universal Infant Free School Meals Thursday, 1st October 2020

The children having a school cooked lunch are clearly enjoying the menu and I would encourage all the children in Classes R, 1 and 2 to have one each day.

The first census of the academic year will take place on **Thursday, 1st October**. The school is required to record the uptake of the Universal Infant Free School Meals on the day, and I am asking that **all** children register to have a hot school meal on **Thursday, 1st October**.

We will only receive money to pay for your child's hot dinners, at any point during the year, if they eat a school meal on the census day.

By eating on the census day you secure the funding for your child for the year and then you are flexible to choose when/if they eat hot school lunches – perhaps in relation to what is on the menu for any given day.

If you are concerned that your child may not eat well enough on census day you can of course send in a packed lunch on that day too. For your information the menu on Thursday, 1st October will be hot dog or vegetarian hot dog with fried onions and tomato ketchup, served with chunky wedges, BBQ beans and vegetable sticks. The main dish will be followed by chocolate sponge and cream.

Further Protective Measures

Staff will be making increased use of face coverings in the communal areas and corridors at school. You will already have seen staff wearing face coverings at the beginning and end of the school day. It is sensible for family members delivering and collecting children to do so also. There continues to be no need for children to wear face coverings.

Coronavirus Symptoms

Children or staff with any of the three symptoms of Covid: **a new continuous cough; a fever; a change in taste or smell** are to stay at home and isolate, as must the rest of their household.

Children and staff must also stay at home and isolate if a member of their household has any of these symptoms.

If the person with the symptoms has a Covid test result which is negative they, and the rest of the household, may return to school or work.

If you do not get a test then the child or member of the household with symptoms must stay at home for 10 days and the rest of the family for 14 days. Following this time if they are well they can return to school or work, if still unwell they are to follow health professional advice.

We recommend that you get a test – you will most likely need to try a number of times to book a test. People who keep on trying are successful in getting one.

Reading Books – Years 1-6

From Friday 2nd October, we are happy to announce that reading books are coming home again.

How is it going to work?

On a **Friday** your child will bring home a book, in a plastic wallet. We would like you to share this with your child, and it needs to be brought back to school on **Tuesday**. It will then go into book quarantine. Your child will complete their reading quiz and then bring a new book home again on Friday.

Some children will have chapter books which might take longer to read, so we would like you to keep them at home until they are finished.

We will monitor which books your children take home and would really appreciate their return so others can share them at a later date.

If a book is lost I am afraid we will need to charge a small fee of £3 to go towards a replacement.
