Collective Worship at St Mary's

We have been learning about the Jesse Tree in our Collective Worship with Mrs Trelfer this week. The Jesse Tree is a way of preparing for Advent by journeying through the stories on Jesus's family tree. Each day of Advent we read a Bible story about someone on Jesus's family tree and hang an ornament or picture symbolizing the story on our Jesse Tree which is in Mrs Trelfer's office – we can see it via videolink! As the tree is decorated we can see how God prepared for Jesus to be born through many generations.

Who can drop off and collect at arrival and dismissal?

I checked with Kent County Council what the position is regarding who should bring and collect children to and from school now that we have moved out of the National Lockdown and into Tier 3. I have been advised that families should continue to use adults from the child's household or one other childcare bubble household to bring and collect children to and from school. Thank vou for vour continued support with this matter.

Bubble Closures

You will be aware that our Year 3 bubble was closed earlier this week due to a positive case of Covid-19 in a pupil.

Early evening yesterday we received notification of a positive result also in a child in Year 2 - we have therefore had to close that bubble as well.

The staff and children from both bubbles are required to isolate at home for a period of time following last contact with the affected child.

In both cases these bubbles will re-open on Monday 14^{th} December. The children are undertaking school work set by their class teachers and are emailing every day with what they have completed.

Please be assured that these cases are not linked. For both children the infection was picked up within their household. Measures we have in place at school have kept to a minimum the number of children and staff who have to self-isolate.

We wish the children who are unwell a speedy recovery and look forward to seeing all of these children and families back at school as soon as is possible.

Advent Windows


It has been a joy to see the windows which have already gone on display. Look out on the school Facebook page for photographs and information about where these are. Huge thanks to everyone involved.
