Why does Easter matter to Christians?

This term we will be learning about the Christian faith through the Christian concept of Salvation. In these lessons we will be exploring the story of Easter and what it means to Christians today.

Life ring

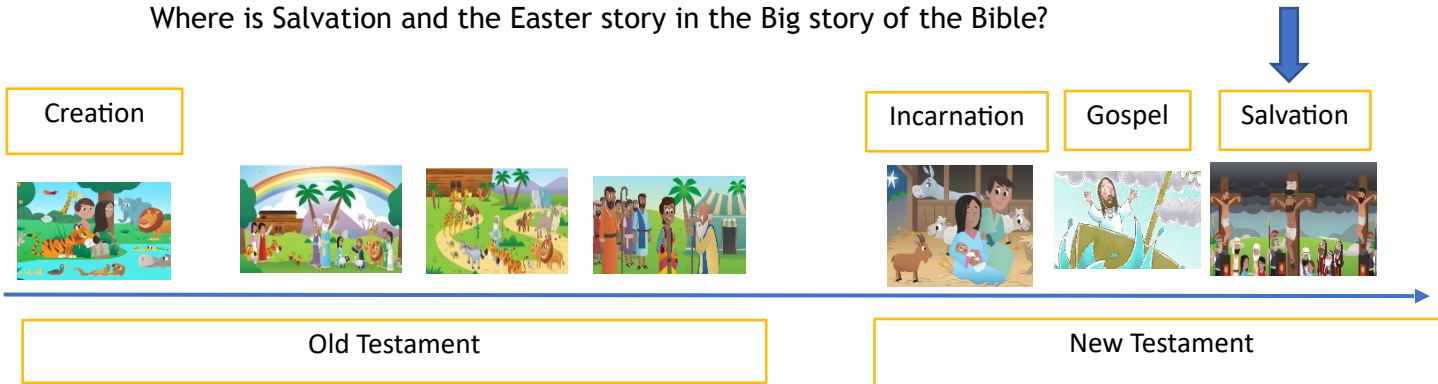


The person on the edge of the swimming pool is using the life ring to help save the person who is struggling in the water. The person in the water puts the life ring over their head to help them float and the person on the edge uses the rope to pull them to safety.

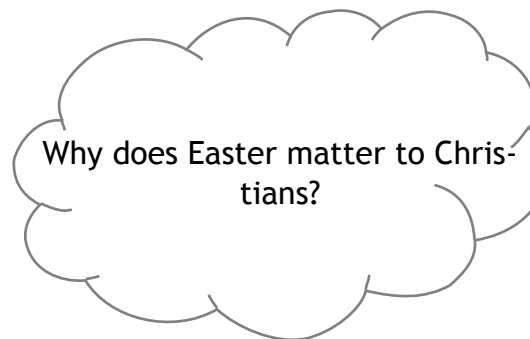
Christians	God	Jesus
People who follow the religion Christianity are called Christians.	Christians believe in God, who created the world and all the things on it. Christians learn about God by reading the Bible, which is their holy book.	Christians believe that Jesus is the son of God, whose death is remembered at Easter.

Salvation	Easter	Palm leaves
Salvation means to 'save' or 'rescue' Christians believe that God sent Jesus to earth to save and rescue humans from all the wrong things they have done.	Easter is a Christian festival where Christians remember when Jesus died on the cross and came back to live again.	Palm trees grew all around Jerusalem. The leaves were used to wave at Jesus as he rode into Jerusalem on a donkey.

Crucifixion	Tomb	Resurrection
Crucifixion was a way that Roman soldiers killed people.	A tomb is a place where bodies were put when someone had died. This image looks like the tomb the body of Jesus was put in.	Resurrection is the word used to describe how Jesus came back to life after dying on the cross.
