Coronavirus Symptoms

Children or staff with any of the three symptoms of Covid:

- · a new continuous cough
- · a high temperature
- a loss or change to your sense of taste or smell

are to <u>stay at home</u> and isolate, as must the rest of their household. They should get a Covid test.
