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
Afternoon Activity

What do Christians do on Good Friday?

Tom and Tessa eat hot cross buns on Good Friday and during Easter. Why do you think they eat them then? Look at the picture of a hot cross bun – what is on the top of them?

How do Christians celebrate Easter Sunday?

Tom and Tessa have got a little bag of Easter Eggs today. Why do you think we have chocolate eggs at Easter time?



You could decorate a hardboiled egg or you could decorate an Easter egg drawn onto paper/card.







Hot cross buns are traditionally eaten on Good Friday, the day that Christians remember Jesus died. This is a 'Jesus' cross. Why is the cross a special shape for Christians?

What can you remember about Jesus and the cross?

Easter Sunday is an exciting day for Christians. They want to tell everyone that Jesus is not dead; he is alive forever. At Church Tom and Tessa sing loud joyful songs and take part in a special Easter shout.

The vicar says in a loud voice: Jesus is risen Everyone shouts back: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!



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While Tom and Tessa eat their buns they look at the crosses. They remember that Jesus died on a cross and then he was buried in a tomb in a garden.

Tom and Tessa also make an Easter Garden. They always put a cross in their garden, why do you think they do that?

Tom and Tessa help the other children make a cross covered in flowers, to show that Jesus is not dead anymore, but alive. They then had an Easter egg hunt in the church garden. We have eggs at Easter as they are a symbol of Jesus' new life. Tom and Tessa think finding eggs is exciting and fun like the first Christians finding Jesus alive.
