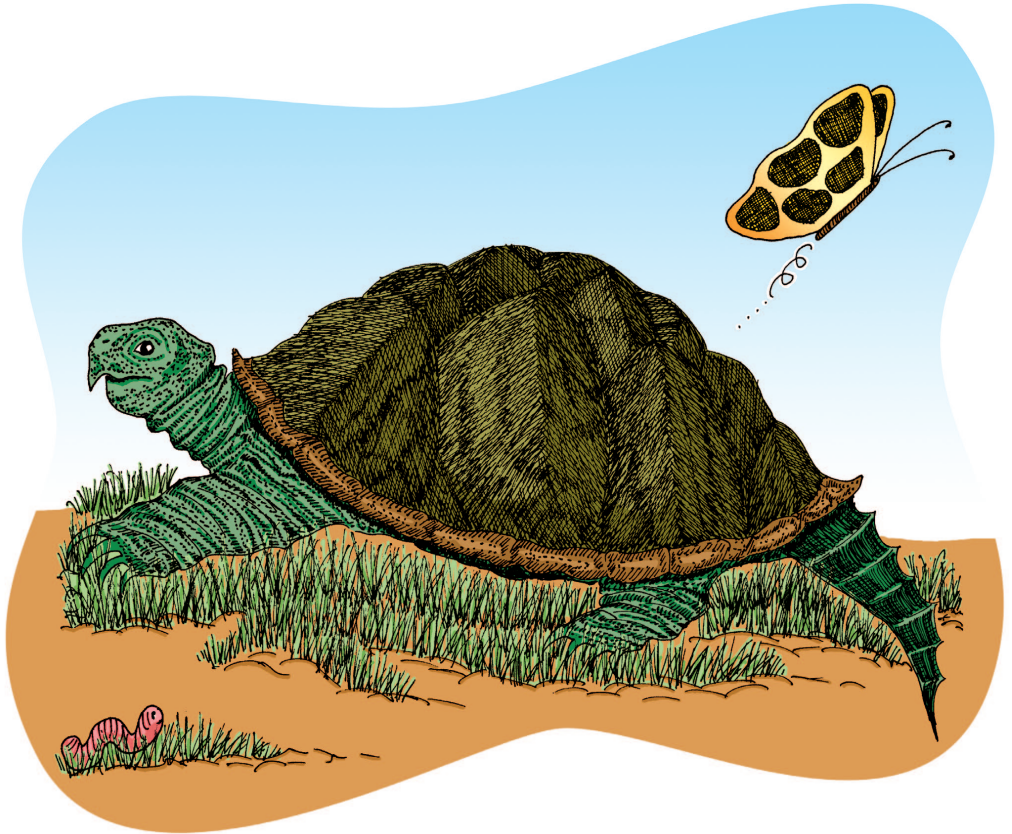

What do you think happens to him?



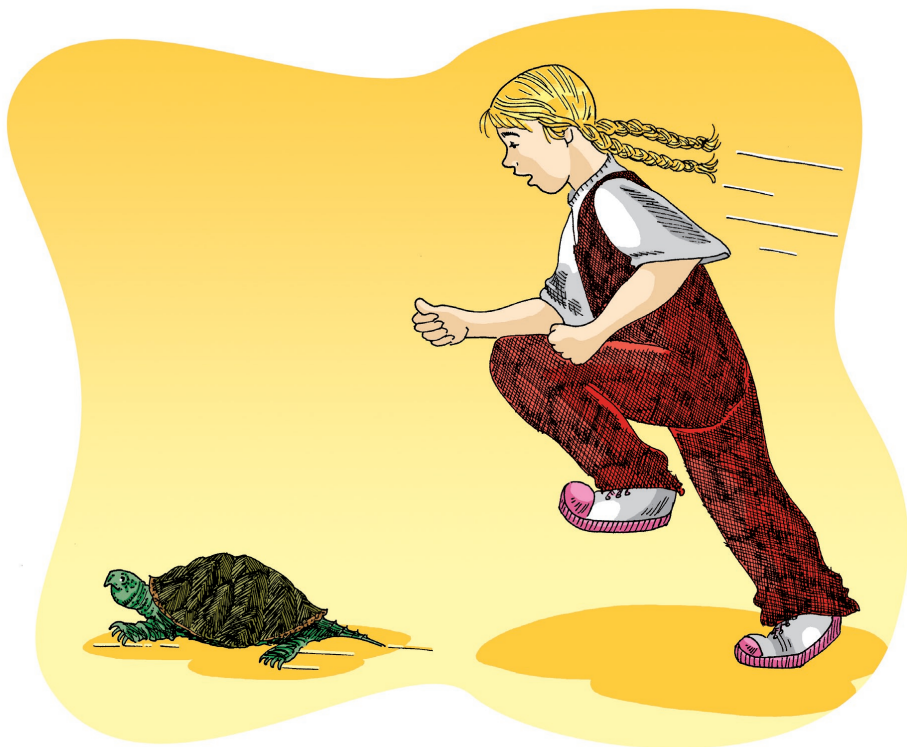
Sad Sam naps.
